He leads teams that consult private and public sector entities on enhanced due diligence, financial crime, money laundering, sanctions, regulatory risk, and complex corporate investigations. He received a Bachelor of Arts in Justice Studies from the University of Guelph and Master of Science in Criminology at the University of Leicester in the United Kingdom. He lectures extensively to private and public sector audiences internationally and has published numerous articles and papers on financial crime.
